## **Discuss:**

Rather than approaching Scripture through the lens of ever-changing culture, we approach culture through the lens of God's timeless truth.

**Eph. 2:2-3**, Paul describes three influences that keep people in the grave:

2 in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience— 3 among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind.

- the world (the ways of this world)
- the devil (the ruler of the power of the air) In the NT the air is the realm of the demonic.
- the flesh (our fleshly desires) One of the sad and destructive desires of the sinful nature is the desire for self-rule.

## Which of the three seems to attack most?

**Ephesians 2:4-5 (NLT Study Bible Text,)** <u>But God</u> is so rich in mercy, and he loved us so much,5 that even though we were dead because of our sins, he gave us life when he raised Christ from the dead.

<u>But God</u> reminds us that salvation came at **God's initiative**. The focus is not on us but on God! And why did He act? Because He is rich in mercy and because of His grace. What did God do?

2:5 He made us alive with Christ; he gave us spiritual life. When you are dead, only a resurrection can help you....(BUT GOD.)
